„Restate“ (2022)

*A concert hall lobby is a place between your everyday life outside and the music you're about to experience inside the venue. We wanted to explore this „no man's land“ by creating a site-specific acousmatic composition in the concert hall lobby of The Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre. Restate uses processed everyday sounds recorded inside the lobby, together with the sound of piano, asking a question „Where does the music start?“. Restate wants to draw the listener's attention to the continuum of noise and tone in the often overlooked, beautiful lobby space with its unique architectural dimensions and acoustic depths.*

„Sanat vuotavat yli kuin kielet“ (2021)

*This piece consists of two duos played first separately and then together. The two dues have completely different formal structures. As both duos contain plenty of repetition, any given section in one duo has to function in multiple different contexts against the other duo. Composing this piece was therefore like putting together a complicated puzzle.*

**Alireza Farajianhamedani** (1993)

„And then... suddenly it happens“ (2021)

*It is a piece for string quartet (commissioned by quartetto Prezioso) the composer started to write this piece in the summer of 2021 in Italy and finished in Estonia. In some parts of this piece the composer is using microtonal and harmony and using this material in some classic forms like Fugue. This piece is partially intuitive and partially calculative. In this piece we have a fragment that appears three times and it is the reason for this title.*

**Elvis Dēliņš** (1999)

„Close eyes; closed heart.“ (2022)

*With tasting the forbidden fruit the human eyes got opened. What pain was felt clearly seeing their unfaithfulness surrounded by all of the divine glory?*

*It makes the human close her poor eyes.*

*And the human still tries to love, but he has closed his aching heart.*

*It leads them only further in darkness.*

*Is there a way out without opening again their abandoned eyes and hearts?*

*The piece dies like the old law [by the feet of Hope].*

*Finished in Porto during Easter of 2022, this piece for string quartet is a personal meditation about universal love.*

**Keelpillikvartett Prezioso** liikmeteks on Hanna-Liis Nahkur (viiul), Mari-Katrina Suss (viiul), Helena Altmanis (vioola) ja Andreas Lend (tšello) ning kollektiiv tegutseb alates 2006. aastast. Köik neli muusikut on lõpetanud Eesti Muusika- ja Teatriakadeemia, kus kvarteti juhendajaks oli Henry-David Varema. Lisaks kvartetimängule on Hanna-Liis, Mari-Katrina ja Helena ka Eesti Riikliku Sümfooniaorkestri liikmed ning Andreas tšellist Rahvusooper Estonias.

Kvartett on edukalt osalenud mitmetel konkursidel ja pälvinud auhinnalisi kohti, andnud arvukalt kontserte ning osalenud festivalidel Eestis, Soomes, Venemaal, Hollandis, Saksamaal, Türgis ja Tšehhis. Prezioso on osalenud Petersen Quarteti, Johannes Goritzki, Lydia Mordkovich, Lluis Claret', David Takeno, Christoph Poppeni jt meistrikursustel. Samuti on kollektiiv korduvalt osa võtnud The International Holland Music Sessions Summer Academy kursustest ning olnud kaastegev Paavo Järvi meistriklassides.

Prezioso on olnud mitmete eesti heliloojate uudisteoste esmaesitajaks, sh Tõnu Kõrvits, Rein Rannap, Kristjan Randalu, Sven Grünberg, Tauno Aints, Margo Kõlar, Timo Steiner, Mirjam Tally, Mariliis Valkonen jt. Samuti on kvartett andnud kontserte ning teinud salvestusi paljude klassikaliste ja pop-jazz muusikutega: Sven Helbig, Antti Siirala, Kristjan Randalu, Rein Rannap, Hando Nahkur, Toomas Vavilov, Age Juurikas, Henry-David Varema, Mihkel Poll, Pirjo Joonas, Iiris Oja, Maarja Purga, Konstantia Gourzi, Arbo Valdma, Kadri Voorand, Estonian Voices, Erki ja Anna Pärnoja, Mikk ja Angeelia Pedaja, Hanna-Liina Võsa, Maarja-Liis Illus, Ott Lepland, NOËP, Iris Vesik, Maria Listra, Hedvig Hanson, Ele Millistfer, Liis Lemsalu, Peeter Volkonski, Ain Agan, Jaak Sooäär, Andre Maaker, Tõnis Mägi, Pille Lill, Kristjan Järvi, Andres Mustonen jt.

Kvarteti debüütalbum koostöös ERP-iga ilmus 2012. a sügisel, sellel kõlavad Pēteris Vasksi, Anton Weberni, Erwin Schulhoffi ja Jaan Räätsa teosed. Prezioso on olnud kaastegev mitmete lauljate, ansamblite ja

instrumentalistide heliplaatidel. Koos Hanna-Liina Võsa ja Kristjan Randaluga toodi KUMU auditooriumis lavale muusikaline monolavastus „Viimane monogaamlane”. Palju on tehtud koostööd dirigent Kristjan Järviga, koos on antud kontserte erinevate ansamblite ja solistidega. Saksa helilooja Sven Helbig pühendas Preziosole uusversiooni oma teosest „Pocket Symphonies”, mis kanti põneva projektina ette koos Hando Nahkuriga kontserdil Estonia kontserdisaalis, kus olid ühendatud tervikuks Sven Helbigu ja Max Richteri teosed. Kvarteti jaoks on olulised nii klassikalist kvartetirepertaari hõlmavad kontserdid kui ka põnevad koostööprojektid. Prezioso mängu iseloomustab energilisus, intensiivsus ja nooruslikkus, kuid ka inimlik sügavus ja eetilisus on kvarteti muusikutele väga hingelähedane ja oluline.
